BLESSED:

A. A word with a diluted meaning

- 1. Bless you when we sneeze
- 2. Say the blessing over the food
- 3. Bless your heart Southern code word / buffer phrase

B. Blessed, a powerful word

- 1. God's favor and protection
- 2. God's action or intervention in our lives favor, gift, benefit, bounty
- 3. We can open the door to more of God's blessings in our lives (Psalm 34:8 NKJV)

A BLESSED MAN (Luke 5:1-9 NKJV)

A. Jesus asked for Peter's help

- 1. He did not force or demand
- 2. He chose to use Peter to help Him help the people
- 3. Jesus' request would require Peter's time and resources

B. Jesus gave Peter a directive

- 1. Required a level of trust on Peter's part
- 2. Contained a level of risk he could have looked foolish fishing in the daytime
- 3. Peter's response was classic Nevertheless at Your word I will

C. Jesus blessed Peter's fishing business

- 1. The catch was astonishing
- 2. Jesus may have had more in mind for Peter He said nets plural
- 3. Peter was involved in opening the door to the major financial blessing

OPENING THE DOOR TO GOD'S BLESSINGS IN OUR LIVES

A. With our service to Him (Hebrews 6:10 NKJV)

- 1. When the Lord says He will not forget it's a good thing
- 2. What we do for others He takes personally
- 3. Contains a level of risk, requires a level of trust appears a waste of time or insignificant

B. With our tithes and offerings (Malachi 3:10-12 NKJV)

- 1. We bring the tithe the first tenth
- 2. He opens the window and pours out blessings
- 3. He also rebukes the devourer so there is a level of protection (blessings in that)
- 4. Other people will call us blessed visible and tangible
- 5. Also contains a level of risk, requires a level of trust may appear foolish to others

C. Don't disqualify yourself

- 1. Peter acknowledged he was sinful but later wrote (1 Peter 2:9 NKJV)
- 2. The blessings start when we open the door to receiving Jesus in our lives
