Part 4: Keeping Hope Alive

THE NEED FOR HOPE (A POSITIVE EXPECTATION)

A. Places we need hope

- 1. Families: Loved ones can be the strongest pull on our hearts
- 2. A sense of purpose: That our lives actually do matter
- 3. That things will turn our well for us: Not just a chance, but a good chance

B. Where do we source this hope

- People in our lives
- 2. Our history and experiences
- 3. Our relationship with God

C. Godly hope, our anchor (Hebrews 6:19 NKJV)

- 1. Anchors keep ships from drifting and being moved off course from ocean currents
- 2. Our hope (expectation) from God keeps our souls from drifting
 - a. Drifting into despair and a sense of despondency
 - b. Our hope in God keeps us from being moved off course from currents of life

WHEN HOPE WAS REALIZED (John 5:2-9 NKJV)

A. An actual pool of hope (Bethesda means "house of mercy")

- 1. God had a place where the sick could be healed
- 2. A place of supernatural hope when the angel stirred the water

B. A man barely holding onto hope

- 1. He had been there for 38 years but he kept coming
- 2. May have been more aware of his limitations than anything else
 - a. He had no one to help him

C. An intervention of the God-kind

- 1. Jesus finds him and asks a seemingly obvious question
- 2. The man answered out of his frustration
 - a. But to his credit he stayed by the pool
- 3. Jesus cut through everything and changed his life
 - a. Cut through the waiting, frustration, lack of help
 - b. He walked away healed hope fulfilled, realized

KEEPING HOPE ALIVE IN YOUR LIFE - NO HOPE IS NOT OK

A. Stay close to hope (hope environments)

- 1. Way too many things steal and drain us of hope
 - a. Bombarded by news, people, circumstances
 - b. The more we look the less we expect something good
- 2. A hope infusion- keeping the hope always coming
 - a. Personal devotion time (Lord's Prayer, 23rd psalm) (Psalm 23 NKJV)
 - b. Church a spiritual pool of Bethesda, a house of mercy

B. Don't identify with your limitations

- 1. Personal limitations... I don't have, I've never been, I've always been, etc.
- 2. Circumstantial limitations... no one to help me, the government, the company
 - a. All of these things can be factors in our lives but not the source of our hope (1 Peter 1:21 NKJV)
 - b. God is bigger than all the limiting factors in my life

C. Choose to believe that God will help you

- 1. He can intervene like no one else and can do what no on else can do
- 2. We keep hope alive by continuing to look to Him
 - a. Big question: what do you believe about _____
- 3. We can always go back to the very basis of our hope (1 Peter 1:3 NKJV)
 - a. If God raised Jesus from the dead then He can help me

Hebrews 6:19 (NKJV)

19 This hope we have as an anchor of the soul, both sure and steadfast, and which enters the Presence behind the veil.

John 5:2-9 (NKJV)

2 Now there is in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate a pool, which is called in Hebrew, Bethesda, having five porches. 3 In these lay a great multitude of sick people, blind, lame, paralyzed, waiting for the moving of the water. 4 For an angel went down at a certain time into the pool and stirred up the water; then whoever stepped in first, after the stirring of the water, was made well of whatever disease he had. 5 Now a certain man was there who had an infirmity thirty-eight years. 6 When Jesus saw him lying there, and knew that he already had been in that condition a long time, He said to him, "Do you want to be made well?"

7 The sick man answered Him, "Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; but while I am coming, another steps down before me."

8 Jesus said to him, "Rise, take up your bed and walk." 9 And immediately the man was made well, took up his bed, and walked.

And that day was the Sabbath.
